1. BTNEP Invites Application for Mini-Grants

The Barataria-Terrebonne National Estuary Program (BTNEP) is pleased to announce the third consecutive year of funding for their successful Mini-Grants Program. The BTNEP created the program in January 2005 to support communitybased restoration, outreach and education projects.

Through the Mini-Grants Program, citizens gain a greater awareness and understanding of the issues facing the Barataria-Terrebonne Estuary System (BTES) and join with BTNEP in creating effective solutions. The Mini-Grants Program also helps BTNEP foster creative partnerships among community groups and broadens the Estuary Program's ability to connect with as many people as possible in preserving our homeland.

BTNEP has \$30,000 available in 2007 for eligible Mini-Grants Program projects, with a minimum of \$1,000 and a maximum of \$5,000 for any one proposal. We are very pleased to announce that this year additional funding has been provided by a generous donation from Chevron/Texaco. Any schools, organizations, individuals, non-profits, government, churches, businesses, or other community groups may apply for Mini-Grant funding, provided that the project takes place within the Barataria-Terrebonne Estuary System (BTES) and meets one or more goals of the BTNEP.

The request for proposals for the 2007 Mini-Grants Program will take place from November 15, 2006 to December 14, 2006. The deadline for proposals is NOON on Thursday, December 14, 2005. 2. Herpetology Hotline

Thanks to a group effort by the three North American societies for professional herpetologists (the Herpetologists' League, the Society for the Study of Amphibians and Reptiles, and the American Society of Ichthyologists and Herpetologists), the Herpetology Hotline is now available to the general public. The Herpetology Hotline allows anyone to submit a question, by means of a web-based form, about the biology of amphibians or reptiles. Once submitted, the question is routed to one of several members of the sponsoring societies who are especially knowledgeable on that particular taxon (e.g., salamanders, frogs, turtles, etc.) or topic (e.g., physiology, behavior, evolution, etc.). A "library" of questions is being saved such that an FAQ page can also be linked to this forum.
