Public television stations all over the United States have been producing educational, informative, and entertaining content for decades. The challenge that many stations have faced is how to provide the public easy access to this valuable material after it has been aired. Over a thousand videos, freely accessible, have accompanying scripts available through a pull down menu. Check out the videos from Louisiana's Sabine Wildlife Refuge, featuring nutrias and alligators, marsh and swamp ecosystems. A great search engine helps you find the videos you might be interested in and can narrow the search to a specific state. Also has a series of great videos on careers. Videos are in the Real Video and QuickTime formats and are five to ten minutes in length. Topics include earth and space, animals, ecosystems, plants, and public policy.
