




**Data Source:**  
 The land-water data were derived from 1:12,000 scale color infrared aerial photography acquired December 2, 2008. All areas characterized by emergent vegetation, wetland forest, scrub-shrub, and upland were classified as land, while open water, mud flats, and aquatic beds were classified as water.
